Thank you all for sharing what makes Gethsemane home for you. The information we received is important to our process as a we look at what makes Gethsemane unique.

There will be further opportunities to engage with the vision process. The vision process which we are going through is important and critical to the future of our church. In end we will have created a road map for growing people to be disciples; a clear set of values held by this church; a simple and active mission mandate; and a list of measures to help us succeed. All of these will guide our vision for the future of Gethsemane.

We are using Simple Church and Church Unique as our guiding books. Gethsemane in the past has had two Transition Teams (latest 2015) and more recently used Simple Church as a ministry tool (2016). But in those years much has changed in our church and community. The Vision Team will be making use of the work done by those teams so that we don't have to work to find the same information that was found previously.

For the sake of transparency from the team to the congregation, Pastor Oakes will be writing up a bi-weekly report and sharing of information of the vision team. These reports, intended to be similar to FDR's fire-side chats, will let the congregation know what is occurring and how they can be involved. Look for them soon.

These amazing Christmas boxes had a very small beginning as they were made by Orphan Grain Train office staff in a Thrivent Action team event in 2017. The Christmas boxes were shipped along with humanitarian aid to Rainbow Network in Managua, Nicaragua and shared with families in need of gifts for their children.

In 2018 there was a Merry Christmas celebration from Orphan Grain Train to children in Nicaragua! Georgina and Ricardo are with Lutheran Hour Ministries in Nicaragua and they had the Christmas celebration for the children in their feeding program. They we able to share OGT Christmas boxes and have a pinata for the children that live in poverty and families have very little to put toward presents.

In the past the Dorcas Guild has generously supported Franklin Graham's Samaritans Shoebox project at Christmas time. In January the Dorcas Guild voted to support the Orphan Grain Train Christmas Gift boxes. The Guild is inviting the congregation to participate in the monthly gathering of items for the Christmas boxes. Beginning in February, and each month thereafter, different items for the Christmas Gift boxes will be collected. Please place the items in the box designated for OGT Christmas Gift Box items which is located on the lower level hallway. The boxes will be categorized for "boy" or "girl" with items appropriate for either age 2 –7 or 8 – 12. We are collecting coloring books and crayons (24 count box).

In the fall the Dorcas Guild will assemble the Christmas Gift boxes. They will be sent to OGT home office in Norfolk, NE. for distribution internationally to recipients who will deliver them to children that may not receive any other Christmas package.
