Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Did you know that Jesus is on a mission? He is on a mission to restore fallen creation to the Kingdom of God. His mission continues in the past, present and future. Locally, Jesus is on the move even in our country, city, and neighborhood.

If we read the news, it may not seem like Jesus is on a mission or even that the Holy Spirit is working in peoples' lives. According to recent polls, 23% of Americans are classified as "none's" religiously; meaning they either identify as atheistic/agnostic or their religion is "nothing in particular". One in four Americans have no religious affiliation. They may believe in Jesus, but they do not attend church. 35% of Millennials (those born from 1981 to 1996) identify as "nones". In fact, even 17% of Baby Boomers identify as "nones". Even Northglenn, which boasts a great number of churches, has a significant number of people in the "nones" category. The most populous age group living in Northglenn is 25-29. This means that our surrounding community is mainly populated by young people and young families, many of whom identify as "none".

These numbers can be disheartening, as they mean that any church that desires to reach others with the Gospel message faces an uphill battle. The culture no longer reflects the church and that is an enormous change from 50 years ago.

But the good news is that these people are not "nones" to Jesus. Gethsemane is in a wonderfully dynamic position to reach people with the gospel. So while the "nones" are on the rise, so is a great need to hear the love, grace, and mercy of Jesus Christ. The mission of spreading Jesus's love for others has never been more needed. Jesus knows this. The Holy Spirit knows this. But do you know this?

Jesus's mission is already here in Northglenn, leading people to himself.

How can we join with him? At Gethsemane will be exploring these questions in the months to come asking: how can we reach the "nones" with God's love?

We have decided to rename and restructure the Simple Church Team. The new name is the Vision Team. We will also expand the number of team members as we are looking for 3 to 4 more church members to join in addition to an Elder and a representative from the school.
