Theme: Equipping God's People for Ministry in Christ GATHERING HIGHLIGHTS

**REV. DR. DALE A. MEYER, our KEYNOTE SPEAKER,** is the tenth president of Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO., a position he has held since 2005. He also serves as a professor of practical theology. He previously occupied the Seminary's Gregg H. Benidt Memorial Chair in Homiletics and Literature 2001-2005. The theme for his presentations on Monday and Tuesday is: "The Way Forward in Our Challenging Times."

**DR. KARA BEASLEY** will discuss the latest information and advancements in deep brain stimulation therapy for tremor control. For about 11 million Americans, involuntary tremors are a constant problem that can interfere with nearly everything. This trembling can be caused by Parkinson's disease, but more often it's caused by Essential tremor, a benign, often inherited condition.

**MR. ZACH KREEGER** is the Area Director of Broomfield/Adams County Young Life. He will tell us about the mission of Young Life and how they are reaching nearly 2,000 unchurched kids per week in Middle Schools, High Schools, YoungLives, and Capernaum groups.

**MS. PAULA ISAKSON** asks "What if congregations began to reach out to the parents of prodigals?" By focusing on the parents, together we can help them to reach out to their prodigal by first breaking down the walls of shame and secrecy. Supported and encouraged, parents become strengthened, experience peace and are enabled to share faith in Jesus Christ with their prodigal.

**REV. DAVID LANGEWISCH**, pastor at Bethlehem Lutheran, will conclude the Gathering with a sermonette at the closing service.

**FORTE STRING TRIO will** entertain us on Monday evening. This doctoral student group from UNC will travel to the past and will be performing compositions from the classical period for string trios.
